We are a people of the word. We encounter the living God in the incarnate Word Jesus Christ, in the word proclaimed in preaching and declared in forgiveness, and in the written word of scripture that holds before us the unfolding story of God's matchless grace. In practice this often means we are also a people of many *words*.

There are times, however, when we may be nourished by simpler fare — where the words spoken aloud are few, and the silence surrounding them calls forth the prayer of those gathered.

The quiet character of Advent with its themes of listening, waiting, and expectation lends itself perfectly to this rite. The theme of our readings embraces the darkness of these long Advent nights as a place where we encounter the beauty and mystery of God. While darkness has sometimes been used as negative foil for light, contrasting evil with good or God's absence with God's presence, our scripture tonight is filled with imagery in which the darkness is filled with the glory of God.


As you gather in your homes, you may begin by lighting a candle by which you may better appreciate the darkness. If you would like, you may light more candles from it during the Hymn of Light.





The Annunciation




