Take time to reflect on the purple cloth which drapes the cross. Purple, the color of royalty, reminds us that Jesus our king offered himself for our redemption.

#### Taizé

A Taizé service is a service of song and silence, prayer and scripture, that offers to lead participants to contemplate and celebrate their relationship with both God and one another. The music repeats many times. It begins with a simple melody that we sing together, and sometimes stays that way, and sometimes builds as it progresses. If you would prefer not to sing and simply listen to the music, please do.

- ++ Texts are short and reflective as well. It is always good to think about a reading, but Taizé invites you to feel a reading and to interact with it.
- ++ Prayer is invitational and conversational. You are not addressing a faraway being, but entering a dialogue with the living present Christ.
- ++ Silence is intentional, there are opportunities to wonder or to consider the words or music you have heard. If a silence feels too long, you might ponder the bulletin cover or focus on the candles or the cloth.
- ++ After the service, you may stay in the sanctuary as long as you like for prayer or simply to dwell in silence.
